



'British Values' is an SMSC4SCHOOLS bespoke workshop for students which will promote their knowledge and understanding of the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.

Explore how citizens can influence decision making through the democratic process.

Consider what is meant by the term 'rule of law' and how living under the rule of law protects individual citizens whilst being essential to well-being and safety.

Understanding that there is a separation of power between the government, parliament and the judiciary (the tripartite system of democracy)

Examine both the variety and growth of faith systems in the UK and how the freedom to choose and hold these faiths is protected in law.

Compare a variety of faith and non-faith value systems expressed in the UK.

Reflect upon the value of diversity whilst challenging discrimination in UK society.

As a bespoke workshop, British values can be delivered to rotating groups in 90 minutes sessions or to one group during the course of the day.
